Managers who participate in this series will gain actionable techniques for engaging both their individual employees and creating high-performing teams, as well as strategies for addressing management “hot topics” such as facilitating difficult conversations. Additionally, specific considerations for managing virtual teams will be addressed throughout the series, as more of our workforce continues to work fully or partially remotely. From those looking to become managers to those who have years of management experience looking to deepen their skills, this series will provide the practical guidance managers need to be successful and contribute to their organization's success in today's world.

Topics will include fundamentals of great management; actionable strategies for increasing employee engagement; harnessing individual & team strengths; creating psychological safety; providing feedback (including conducting performance reviews and creating accountability measures), effective delegation, & more!
